

What to *Ignore* and What to *Engage*

Ignore

- Attention-seeking behavior
- Battle of wills
- Anything that happens immediately after NO
- Cursing/disrespectful behavior
- Negotiation
- Begging/pleading/whining
- Anything annoying

Engage

- When there are tear from real pain or sadness
- When your child is in danger
- Vandalism/Stealing
- When someone else can get hurt
- When being left alone is the point
- The GOOD STUFF (next slide)

Don't Forget The Good Stuff









Pandemic Parenting Caveat 1 & 2

If you say NO, you have to follow through.

If you aren't up to following through, just say YES or Ignore It!.

IF THERE IS SOMETHING THAT WE WISH TO CHANGE IN THE CHILD, WE SHOULD FIRST EXAMINE IT AND SEE WHETHER IT IS NOT SOMETHING THAT COULD BETTER **BE CHANGED IN OURSELVES**
