**Abbey Malbon**



Abbey is a student from Aurora, Illinois who recently graduated from Metea Valley High School, and has been working in District 204 to create an impact in her community. Abbey will share how she took an idea for positive change into action, and how you can too. In March 2018, Abbey began advocating for compliance with a recent Illinois state law, the Learn With Dignity Act, which requires that all middle & high schools provide their students with free menstrual products in bathrooms. Throughout her activism, she organized a group of students named M.A.N. (Menstruator Action Network) and was featured on WGN, the Chicago Tribune, and published an opinion editorial in Teen Vogue. She will share how she plans on continuing to fight for this change in college, and will provide tips & tools for youth to create change around issues they are passionate about.
